Scheduling Timeline

January

- Counselors present information on Thursday, January 16th- Flex meeting
- Students review course planning worksheets and Cathedral Course Guide (CathedralCourseGuide.com) with their parents to select classes that fit their interests and meet requirements
- Students choose classes for the next school year on PowerSchool (January 17th- 24th)

February/March

- Counselors meet with students to discuss schedule, goals, and progress. This will be during your college planning meeting.
- Recommendations will be automatic unless teachers update level in PowerSchool.
- Schedule changes can be made through the counselor until March 26th.

Cathedral Core 40 Diploma

- 10 semesters of English (includes Speech/Debate and Composition)
- 8 semesters of Math (must take math each year at Cathedral)
- 6 semesters of Science (Biology, Chemistry or Physics, plus 2 other semesters)
- 6 semesters of Social Studies (World History, US History, Government, Economics)
- 4 semester of one World Language
- 2 credits of Fine Arts
- 2 semesters of PE, 1 semester of Health
- 8 semesters of Theology
- Service hours

Core 40 with Academic Honors

In addition to the basic Core 40 requirements:

- An additional two credits in World Language ۲ (three years of the same World Language or 2 years each of two different languages) Semester grades must be at a C- or higher, no D's in core subjects outlined for Core 40. Cumulative grade point average must be a 3.0 at the time of graduation
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PLUS...Complete <u>ONE</u> of the following:

- A. 4 semesters of AP credit and complete corresponding exams
- Complete 6 college credits worth of dual credit coursework Β.
- 4 semesters of IB courses and complete corresponding exams C.
- D. Earn a composite score of 1250 or higher on the SAT and a minimum of 560 on math and 590 on the evidence-based reading and writing section.**
- Earn a composite score of 26 on the ACT and complete the writing section E.
- Earn 2 of the following: F.

3 college credits of dual credit coursework







The Online Course Request Process

- Students will complete the worksheet and choose their courses online from home.
- Parents should review the courses with their student.
- Counselors will meet individually with students and parents January through March. They will review selected courses, discuss their progress and college and career information.
- The scheduling window opens Friday, January 17 & closes at the end of the day Friday, January 24.


